Buchi Emecheta, The Bride Price – a novel set in Nigeria outlining a young woman's struggle with the traditional expectations of a young bride

Clementine Wamariya, The Girl Who Smiled Beads – the moving autobiography of a young girl who fled the genocide in Rwanda with her older sister and spent many years as a refugee in various neighbouring countries before finally settling in the USA

Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie, Dear Ijeawele – a manifesto by the acclaimed Nigerian author written for a friend requesting advice on how to raise her baby daughter to be a feminist
